## **Driving Directions**

The University of Washington, Bothell is about 15 miles north of Seattle, located off I-405 at exit 24, the Beardsley/195<sup>th</sup> NE exit (about 5 miles south of where I-405 and I-5 join). Off the north/south I-405 freeway, head west. After 1/8 mile, turn left into the campus. At the stop sign on campus, turn left.
