Discussed future conference sites

LSU-Shreveport 2013

University of Houston 2014

Awaiting confirmation of a Dallas conference in 2015 and would like to explore hosting a conference in the Woodlands in 2016 due to its closer proximity to the Houston airport.

Some concern was expressed about dropping registration numbers. One suggestion was to try to plan conferences in a central location to minimize travel expenses for active participants in the region, at least until the economy changes.

A schedule for the next year was proposed as follows:

1 April 2012	Last day to early register by mail.
8 April 2012	Student poster submissions reported deadline

Steering committee welcomes Anne Marie Eubanks (SFA) and Rakesh Verma (UH). Shyam Karrah was also elected to a 3-year position. Phyllis Tedford will serve 1 year to replace William Denny, who is retiring.

Attendance at conference was reported as 44 total attendees of which 36 were full CCSC memberships.

Evaluation of 2011 conference: The location of the conference was good (physically adjacent to the hotel and within walking distance of the food). However, IT support for wireless internet connectivity should be better (the LEMIT building's special guest account allowing fast internet access should have been part of the registration packet). Vendors and booksellers need to be contacted early and provided with a physical shipping address (they have to have time to arrange schedules and get permission to come and either make travel arrangements or ship materials).
