The Fall 2018 board meeting has been set for 7:00 p.m. September 27, 2018 immediately prior to the Midwest regional conference at Ball State University, Muncie, IN. The conference will be held on September 28, 29.

Report of the President

My term as president will end on July 31 of this year. This is the last Board Meeting I will preside over. I would like to express my gratitude to each of you for your support, hard work and cooperation.

John Meinke's term as publication chair is ending this year as well. On behalf of the board I would like to express our appreciation for the long service for CCSC.

Paul Tyman and Mike Erlinger, former NSF POs, have received funding from the NSF for the creation of a CCSC Showcase similar to the SIGCSE NSF Showcase. This includes a workshop provided by Paul Tyman, Mike Erlinger of another NSF PO on NSF proposal preparation. It also includes a conference slot for an NSF PI to present the essence of their particular project. Ideally, the NSF PI would be someone outside of the local region but their research is of interest to that Region.

We have four Gold Level partners including Turing's Craft, Google for Education, GitHub, and NSF. We also have three Bronze Level partners including National Center for Women and Information Technology, Teradata University Network, and zyBooks.

Since we last met in Fall 2017, we have resolved several issues. Most importantly, thanks to Susan Dean, the update of the standing rules to reflect the current duties of the vice president, membership secretary, membership system administrator, treasurer and conference coordinator. Two new standing rules have been added for the roles of the UPE liaison and the associate membership secretary positions.

There are several issues that we still need to consider. Foremost on the list is continuing the Future Directions commission work in the areas of membership and publication. Susan Dean is developing documentation for the financial, accounting and membership procedures to ensure a smooth transition to the Treasurer and Membership secretary positions. The Board's task will be to oversee the process and provide the needed assistance. We still need to consider the permanent address for the Consortium. Susan Dean has contacted ACM regarding having CCSC Permanent mailing through ACM. Unfortunately, ACM refused to offer this service due to the many "in cooperation" events that ACM takes part in.

I am looking forward to working with you on these issues in Baltimore. I hope we can get most of these issues resolved during the meeting.

Move from Membership System Administrator duties described in SR 6:

- b. Provide timely reports to support membership, financial, publications, and other Board functions, reflecting accurate and up-to-date membership information. (*Becomes f. under rule 2*)

SR 6 (Membership System Administration duties):

- a. Coordinate with individual regional/conference registrars to ensure that conference-related registration information is kept up to date. (*Rewording of what was item c.*)

New item:

- b. Provide support and coordination between the online registration system and online payment systems as specified by the Board.

Delete SR 8 (Conference Coordinator) as this position has not been filled since Fall 2016.

16. The UPE (Upsilon Pi Epsilon) Liaison shall provide a regular report to UPE on student activities sponsored at individual CCSC conferences by UPE grants.

Spring 2018 Conferences

A summary of the statistics for the spring 2018 conferences follows:

Please note that the figures above reflect what appears in the *Journal*. They do not reflect the final program for each conference in which there might have been additional workshops and such. In addition, note that these figures are hand computed so are subject to possible off-by-one miscounts.

Please also note that I have no information regarding this Spring's Northeastern conference. As of this writing there have been no manuscripts received. In addition, Northeastern is trying a different manuscript submission process this year. When I requested that manuscripts be forwarded to me as soon after receipt as possible so that I could stay on top of them I was told that nothing could be sent on until the submission site was closed, which would be 6th February so manuscripts would start appearing to me after midnight as soon as the site was closed! At this point I have major doubts about whether we can actually have final copy available for the conference!

Once again, my thanks to the editorial team, Susan Dean and Baochuan Lu, as well as the folks I worked with from the individual Spring 2018 conferences: David Naugler, Baochuan Lu, Laura Baker, Megan Thomas, and Pat Virtue. They all proved once again wonderful to work with! My thanks also to our printer, Courier Printing, as well as to Susan Dean and Baochuan Lu who helped tremendously in proof-reading.

Timely Submission of Manuscript Copy

Please negotiate manuscript due dates. Please keep in mind that conference weekends seldom turn out to be the same weekend year after year. This is particularly true in the Spring

since Easter floats over approximately a one month time span. That moved some of our Spring conferences up trying to get some of the individual conferences in prior to Easter! Please let's discuss these dates ahead of time! Also note the Northeastern problems this year, plus keep in mind that all of the final work is being accomplished by volunteers and events in their lives (including non-anticipated events) can impact final copy production.

I would also note that it takes time to get final copy up on the ACM Digital Library! We submit our final copy to ACM in a form that lends itself well to being loaded to the Digital Library quickly. However, that must still fit into ACM's schedule! Moving everything to digital is not going to solve deadline needs for manuscript preparation!

Internet Presence

Another stuck on a broken record: It is important that each of our regions has an up-to-date presence on its web site. This includes having the conference program posted as early as possible. We cannot expect folks to register for the conference without at least being able to see a program. I personally would not register for a conference when I haven't seen the program prior to registering, and a number of our regions are posting the registration process long prior to posting the final program, or even a preliminary program. I also note that I use the regional committee and the conference committee for the proceedings and accomplish that when starting to work on the proceedings. Regional representatives need to take this message back to their regions. Regional web sites must be kept up to date!

Print Runs

We are definitely doing much better on projecting print runs! One of the Fall issues was right down to the last copy between shipments to the conference and the bulk mail run! We can't do that every time, but our membership secretary is definitely in the process of working out an algorithm to come as close as possible without risking running out.

ACM Digital Library

Simply to have this item reiterated, we have had presenters not show up for their presentations at some of the conferences. If that is the case we can have the paper pulled from the ACM Digital Library *provided* the call for participation states such clearly. This is in line with ACM's policy. Regional representatives: please make certain that this gets communicated to whoever prepares your call for participation! A request to pull a manuscript from the Digital Library should go to me along with the evidence that the call for conference participation indicated such.

Update regarding form of proceedings

At our Fall meeting there was a request for additional information regarding printing on demand. Baochuan Lu (as candidate Publications Chair) followed through for me. Here is what he found regarding pricing, minimum print runs, and shipping:

Central Plains Conference 2018

Our 24th annual conference is scheduled for April 6-7 at the Northwest Missouri State University, Maryville, MO. Scott Bell is the current conference chair with Rex McKanry serving as a co-chair and the 2019 conference chair.

Our opening keynote speaker is Katie Hendrickson, Director of State Government Affairs, Code.org. The topic of her talk will be *Computer Science is for Everyone*. The banquet speaker is Alicia Dwyer Cianciolo, NASA engineer. Her talk is titled *Flight Planning From 300 Million Miles Away: Computing Techniques for Landing on Mars*. The Saturday morning keynote will be given by Dr. Reza Derakshani, University of Missouri-Kansas City School of Computing and Engineering. His talk is titled *Biometrics: Past, Present and Future*.

- Michael Rogers, Northwest Missouri State University and Bill Siever, Washington University will present a SIGCSE sponsored pre-conference workshop titled "*An Iota of IoT*."
- Proposals for 22 papers, 4 tutorials/workshops, 4 panels and 7 nifty-assignments were received. We accepted 12 papers for an acceptance rate of 54%. 2 tutorials/workshops and 4 nifty assignments were accepted. In addition to papers, panels, tutorials/workshops and nifty-assignments, the conference will feature lightning talks, a student programming contest and a student poster contest.
- Cerner Corporation is once again sponsoring scholarships for K-12 teachers who attend the conference. In addition, a meeting of the Missouri Computer Science Teachers Association will be held on Saturday afternoon after the conclusion of the conference.

We had another invigorating Eastern conference at Muhlenberg College last fall, October 20-21, 2017. The energy and enthusiasm from the 2016 conference continued in 2017 and we hope to continue that momentum into 2018. Muhlenberg College provided a wonderful space for the conference and was a very generous host. Co-chairs George Benjamin and Jorge Reyes-Silveyra and their wonderful committee did a great job organizing the event. Pulling off a good conference is a lot of work and all of these volunteers should be commended. The conference presented 18 posters, 3 workshops, 3 tutorials, 2 panels, 2 vendor demos, and 15 papers in 5 sessions. For papers, we had a 57% acceptance rate. We had 72 registered attendees, 7 student attendees, and 19 programming teams. The programming competition is always a highlight with winning teams from Muhlenberg College, Ramapo College, and James Madison University.

The keynote speaker was Dr. Armin Mikler, Professor of Computer Science and Engineering at The University of North Texas, who presented, “Computational Intelligence and Big Data Challenges in Computational Epidemiology and Population Health”. The banquet speaker was Mr. Chris Dunham, Jr., Directory of Digital Communications for Minor League Baseball, who presented, “Evolving Technology in the Sports Field”. Southeast Regional Report

Kevin Treu

1. Fall 2017 CCSC:Southeastern Conference

The 31st CCSC Southeastern Conference was hosted by Furman University in Greenville, SC on Nov 3-4, 2017. There were only 59 registrants (10 of whom were students, and 11 of whom were first time attendees). This is a drastic drop from the 94 registrants we had in 2016. (And from 80 registrants in 2015, and 98 registrants in 2014.) The program included 15 papers, 2 tutorials, 1 workshop, a “nifty assignments” session, a national partner session, and a session of student presentations from our student research competition. A total of 25 regular papers were submitted (same as last year) of which 15 were accepted, for an acceptance rate of 60%, compared to 52% in 2016, 57.1% in 2015, 54.5% in 2014, 46.8% in 2013 and 2012 and 60% in 2011. (The acceptance rate for tutorials/workshops was 100% -- 3 of 3 submissions.) Student participation was very high, with 26 teams consisting of 120 students representing 15 schools in the programming contest. Only 5 (down from 12) students authored papers in the student paper contest, representing 3 different institutions. Winners in the programming contest were Bob Jones University A (1st), Bob Jones University B (2nd), and Covenant College (3rd).

2. Fall 2018 CCSC:Southeastern Conference

Roanoke College in Salem, VA will host the 2018 conference on November 2-3. Anil Shende and Durell Bouchard are the site chairs. The rest of the Conference Committee has not yet been determined. The conference web site is:

The call for participation is available at the site. May 11 is the deadline for paper submissions. (September 24 is the deadline for abstracts for the Student Research Contest.) Student activities will again include a programming contest and student paper competition. Details of each are available on the web site. The keynote and banquet speakers have yet to be determined.

3. Future CCSC:Southeastern Conferences

Auburn University will host for the first time in November of 2019. Dates have not yet been finalized. UNC-Wilmington has committed to hosting in 2020. Several institutions have expressed interest in possibly hosting beyond 2020, including potential new hosts Bob Jones University and the University of West Florida, and ETSU, which last hosted in 1996. We will be aggressively recruiting hosts, considering the fact that Roanoke and Furman have been bearing the bulk of the hosting load in recent years.

4. Other Regional Issues/Activities

Overall Health of the Region – There are some concerns here. Though we've been successful recently in lining up hosts, membership seems stagnant. Registration dropped off a cliff in 2017. Essentially, only presenters and programming contest sponsors and very few others registered. Although the number of submissions remained steady, it's still down from where we were a few years ago. Consequently, I have concerns about the long term health of the region. I hope to discuss with other representatives how things are going in their regions and what they're doing to keep them vital.

Task Force Initiatives – The regional board is working on some initiatives that are expected to improve the conference and the operations of the region. Specifically:

- Review and assessment of bi-annual meeting procedures to address problems of attendance
- Continued refinement of the ConfTool system for paper submission and reviewing
- Consideration of other alternative forms of presentation and participation at the conference, such as the new “nifty assignments” session
- Continued testing and dissemination of a comprehensive conference hosting manual

Reports on these initiatives are expected at the regional board meeting on March 4, with specific recommendations to be discussed and adopted.

Hala ElAarag called the meeting to order at 7:07 pm.

All present introduced themselves.

Cathy Bareiss moved and Lotfy Mohamed seconded a motion to approve the agenda. Agenda was approved.

The Fall 2018 CCSC Board of Directors Meeting will be at 7:00 p.m. September 27, 2018 immediately prior to the Midwest regional conference at Ball State University, Muncie, IN. The conference will be held on September 28 and 29.

Cathy Bareiss moved and Judy Mullins seconded a motion to approve the location for both the spring 2019 meeting of the Board of Directors and the CCSC Annual Business Meeting to be at the SIGCSE Conference in Minneapolis, Minnesota. The CCSC Board of Directors will meet on Wednesday, February 27, 2019 from 7:00 pm. to 11:00 pm. The CCSC Annual Meeting will be held on Friday, March 1, 2019 following the SIGCSE Business Meeting. Locations were approved.

We thanked John Meinke, Publications Chair, for his many years of service. He will complete his term on July 31, 2018. We approved Baochuan Lu as the new Publications Chair beginning a three-year term on August 1, 2018. John reported that he Susan Dean will assist Baochuan this fall as he begins the position.

Approved the recommendations from the Nominating Committee. There are three Regional Representative positions to be filled in the 2018 Spring Election. The nominee for Northwest is Brent Wilson from George Fox University. The nominee for South Central Region is Tina Johnson from Midwestern State University. The nominee for Southeastern Region is Kevin Treu from Furman University. The nominee for Vice President/President-Elect is Karina Assiter from Landmark College. The slate of nominees will be taken to the Annual Business meeting on Friday, February 23, 2018. Additional candidates can be nominated from the floor at this meeting. Mike Erlinger shared that he and Paul Tyman have received funding from the NSF for the creation of a CCSC Showcase similar to the SIGCSE NSF Showcase. Travel money is now available to invite NSF PIs to participate in CCSC Regional Conferences. They plan to work with each individual CCSC Regional Conference to determine the particular involvement for that conference.

Reviewed Reports as submitted.

President (Hala ElAarag) – Expressed her appreciation to the board for their help and support the past two years during her term as CCSC President. Her term ends July 31, 2018. We thanked Hala for her service.

Vice President (Jeff Lehman) – Reported that the SIGCSE In-Cooperation agreement paperwork must be submitted one-year in advance. Spring conferences should be submitted in May and fall conferences in November.

Publications Chair (John Meinke) reported that there was an issue with late papers. Regional representatives are reminded that papers need to be submitted at least 8 weeks ahead of the paired conference. It is helpful to submit papers as they are received rather than waiting until all paper have been submitted. Baochuan Lu reported he is looking at alternate publishing options and prices.

Membership Secretary (Susan Dean) reported there are approximately 538 regular members as of February 5, 2018.

Treasurer Report (Brian Hare) reported that our revenues still exceed our expenses. He continues to review procedures for efficiency tweaks. One issue is that when people pay on-site we need their conftool id to match money and cash with attendees
